Application of membership received from Mr. *John W. Ingle Jr.* M. & S. that the election of officers be held on June 7th, 1927 and members to be notified.

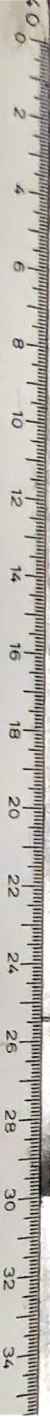

It was regularly moved and seconded, that the Secretary be instructed to communicate with President Miller, President of the N.Y. Boston & Westchester R.R. concerning the new schedule of trains which emits a stoppage at Columbus Avenue, Mount Vernon, asking for the reiteration of that station as a transfer point. (carried)

The necessity of having a school in this community was thoroughly discussed, with the result that a committee of four was formed, to be known as the "School Committee". The following members were selected for this purpose.

A set of RESOLUTIONS drawn as the sense of the mass meeting, held on June 28th was read, and the secretary instructed to forward a copy to President Daniel J. Meyer, of the Board of Education, District #2-another copy was ordered to be sent to the Tuckahoe Record, for publication.

A motion was made by Mr Medlar and seconded by Mr Worth, that instead of a monthly collection of dues, that they be made semi-annually viz January and July. Carried.

It was moved and seconded, that this Association go on record as being unalterably opposed to the erection of a gas station in this section. Mr Medlar, also proposed a letter to the Town Board of Eastchester, giving the associations views on this subject be sent, with the reasons therefore. This was seconded by Mr Spiro, and unanimously carried.

Mr Spiro, made a motion that the secretary write to the Town Board, asking them to take up with the N.Y., Westchester & Boston RR the necessity of widening the bridge under the tracks, which has been the scene of many accidents this summer and also requesting that a stationary light be installed there. Carried

The secretary was instructed to write to the Parkway Commission, asking for the removal of the iron fence and stone pillars at the railroad station, in order that automobiles be given room to turn around at that point. Carried.

The following members were proposed for membership. Leo J. Murray, Ray McDonald, Eric Anderson, Wm Taich and Jos. D. Cook. The initiation fee of one dollar accompanied each application.

A general review of conditions affecting such streets as Hillcrest Road, Central Drive and Park View Drive, was brought to the attention of the members, disclosing the fact of the non-existence of lights on these thoroughfares, and the almost impassable condition of the streets, which have never been paved.

Hydrants for fire department use was also urged for Hillcrest Road and Central Drive.

It was unanimously voted to have your secretary communicate with the Board of Supervisors, explaining the light necessity for the streets mentioned and also to forward to the Board of Fire Commissioners, a recommendation for fire hydrants to be installed on Hillcrest Road and Central Drive.

A delegation of four gentlemen were present from the Hutchinson Manor section, in the person of Messrs Martin W. Davis, William J. Bardino, John Capidaglis and Joseph Tigg. These gentlemen signed application blanks with the accompanying initiation fee, and on motion of Mr Eibell, Section 6 of the By-Laws, was temporarily suspended for this evening and acted upon immediately. The secretary was instructed to cast one ballot for their election in this association. The ballot was cast as ordered.

Moved by Mr Sibell, that the section of the by-laws, section 6 be temporarily suspended, and the secretary was instructed to cast one vote. Carried.

1927

The meeting was called to order by President Evans, at 8.30 PM. 15 members were in attendance.

After a long and comprehensive report from the members of the School Committee it was finally decided that our committee should approach the School Board, and ask that a new school be erected in this district. Mr A.S. Medlar, who has familiarized himself with the school situation, was made a member of the School Committee.

On motion of Mr Busteed, and seconded by Mr Spiro, the secretary was instructed to communicate with the Parkway Commission again, requesting them to remove the fence and pillar obstructions at the approach of the railroad station. Carried.

Mr Busteed, also made a motion, to have the secretary write the Town Board on the necessity of installing lights under the railroad tracks and at the entrance to the station. Seconded by Mr Blumberg. Carried.

Motion by Mr Medlar, and seconded by Mr Worth, directing the secretary to write to the Town Board, on existing conditions of the water furnished by the New Rochelle Water Company, also enclosing a copy of our letter to that company on the subject. Carried.

The meeting adjourned at 10.30 PM.
