Tuesday February 5th 1949

The meeting was called to order by Mr Leo Murray in the chair, owing to the absence of President Evans and vice President Glaser.

After some discussion regarding the vote to be taken at Tuckahoe in the school site action, it was decided to call an open meeting at the Chester Heights Fire Station on Thursday evening, February 7th. The motion was unanimously carried.

The secretary was instructed to communicate with the Board of Supervisors re the filthy condition of the Chester Heights entrance, by the burning of garbage and refuse in the lots adjoining the station. A copy to be sent to Captain Scanlon, of the Police Dept.

Motion by Mr Logan & duly seconded that the Secretary be instructed to write to the New Rochelle Water Co as to unsatisfactory quality of the drinking water in this vicinity. Carried.

Motion by Mr Bloomberg and duly seconded, that the CTTA. strongly object to any change of zoning leading to increase the areas in which apartments are to be permitted, especially in reference to that property under consideration fronting on California Rd between New Rochelle Rd and the At Vernon line, for the reason that there is sufficient provision already for apartment sites in that neighborhood, and that the proposed change would injure adjacent property as to the use for which it was intended.

Mr Bloomberg agreed to present the foregoing motion in the form of a letter at a meeting of the Town Board on Wednesday eve April 3^d.
 Mr Bloomberg also agreed to take up the question of necessary sidewalks on ~~W.E.D.~~ at the same meeting of the Board.

Mr Evans presented his resignation which was accepted with reluctance and regret.

This Asso. requests that the laws & regulations concerning dogs be adhered to strictly. There are a number of muzzled ^{and} unmuzzled dogs at large in this community which are a menace to life & limb.

The Secy was instructed to write to the Kitch of Elec Co regarding the tool house at the bottom of Archers Drive & recommending its removal.

The proposed site is on the West side of California Road about 200 ft. South of Hewitt Avenue. The plot is 200 x 400 with streets on three sides. The ground is fairly level and slightly above the street grade. The price is seventy five cents a square foot.

It was regularly moved by Mr. Aingle and seconded by Mr. Pacci, and motion carried, that this Association express its approval of the site proposed, as to location, and it suggests to the School Board that they consider the advisability that a larger plot be purchased to provide for play grounds.

Further, this Association hereby petition the School Board to act on this proposition as soon as possible.
